His research focussing on the causes and the impact of unemployment, job satisfaction and productivity have proved highly influential.

Phelps is also an honorary professor at universities throughout the world and has been awarded numerous honorary doctorates.

Career

During his career, Phelps has served as a consultant for organisations such as the European Bank for Reconstruction & Development (EBRD), the International Monetary Fund, the European Commission, the U.S. Treasury Department and the Senate [Finance](#) Committee. The fact that he has occupied so many advisory roles demonstrates his ability and reputation, as does his speaking. Phelps has made speeches and given lectures all over the world, sharing his research and in depth knowledge with governments, other economists and students. He has been a participant at the World Economic Forum in Davos for many years.

In 2001, Phelps founded the Center on Capitalism and Society. He is currently director of the society, in which economists and those in related fields examine the impact of capitalism on society and challenge conventional views regarding national and international economic policy.

Like other foremost academics, Phelps has also worked as a professor, inspiring and challenging the next generation of economists. During his career he has worked with Yale University, Columbia University, New York University and the University of Pennsylvania and has been a visiting professor at many more, including the Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT). He is currently a dean of Minjiang University in China.

Phelps studied at Amherst College in Massachusetts before obtaining his Ph.D. in economics from Yale in 1959.
